

Suggested tour – the Vissenbjerg area

Experiences for all the family!



Assens

Half or full day tour – length around 35 km

1 Start – Vissenbjerg Storkro inn:

Turn right along Søndersøvej and continue straight on until you come to the Terrarium in Vissenbjerg and Vissenbjerg Bakker hills on your right.

2 The Terrarium in Vissenbjerg:

A specialist zoo with one of Scandinavia's largest collections of reptiles, amphibians, scorpions, insects and spiders, etc.

3 The Vissenbjerg Bakker hills:

Go "mountaineering" on Funen – the Vissenbjerg Bakker hills are part of the Funen Alps in Denmark. Here, at the top of Funen, glaciers left a large area of mighty hills, steep slopes and deep ravines. When you reach "Udsigten" (the viewpoint), you are 129 metres above sea level, where you can enjoy a wonderful view of Brændholt Bjerg and Frøbjerg Bavnehøj.

4 Lilleskov Teglværk brickworks:

Continue the tour towards Tommerup Stationsby. Take a slight detour out of Lilleskovvej to see to Lilleskov Teglværk brickworks. The museum was founded in 1985 to preserve the brickworks and run it as a museum. It is only open a few days a year. Groups are welcome to visit outside opening hours by appointment.

5 The Galaksen adventure playground in Nårup:

The tour then takes you to the village of Nårup, which is home to the wonderful By-stævne Galakse adventure playground – the result of the phenomenal work of volunteers, and well worth a visit. Along with the village hall, it is now Nårup's top meeting place where locals and outsiders alike can have fun. It features a ball pitch, an aerial ropeway, a playground, two pétanque courts, a bonfire ring and picnic tables and benches. A pleasant place to eat your picnic.

6 Danmarks Fugle Zoo (Denmark's bird zoo):

From Nårup, you continue along Skovvej, which takes you to Denmark's most scenic and idyllic bird park. In the park you can experience some 800 different birds from all over the world, including storks, ostriches, parrots, web-footed birds and owls.

7 Frøbjerg Bavnehøj – the highest point on Funen:

Head for Frøbjerg and climb Frøbjerg Bavnehøj, which is 131 metres high. The views from here are far-reaching. The landscape was formed during the Ice Age. In days of old, beacons ("bavner") were lit on the hills around the country as a means of communication. Every year, the amateur dramatics society, Frøbjerg Fespil, stages a well-attended play on the hill.
